SECTION A NEW TESTAMENT

- 1. Different titles are given to Jesus in the Gospels. Examine any two of these titles and explain their meaning and significance.
- 2. What do the parables contribute to the teaching of Jesus?
- 3. From reading the New Testament what do we learn about the nature of the Christian Church in the first century?
- 4. Examine carefully Paul's ethical teaching.

SECTION B

OLD TESTAMENT

- 1. What do you believe to be the most notable features of the portrayal of God in the Old Testament?
- 2. Describe the events that led to Saul becoming king and assess his reign.
- 3. 'The prophets of Israel were always ignored'. Assess this view.
- 4. Has the Wisdom Literature of the Old Testament any religious value for today?

SECTION C

STUDIES IN THE PHILOSOPHY OF RELIGION

- 1. Examine the proposition that it is only through revelation that God is known.
- 2. Discuss the view that a person cannot believe in both predestination and free-will.
- 3. 'A religious experience is not a reliable way to understand the nature of God/Ultimate Reality'. Evaluate this statement.
- 4. 'Belief in life after death is the single most important influence on how religious believers live their lives'. Evaluate this statement.

SECTION D

RELIGION AND CONTEMPORARY ISSUES, INCLUDING ETHICAL MATTERS

- 1. 'Religious and scientific views of the origins of human life are incompatible'. Discuss this view.
- 2. Are religious believers free to make their own moral decisions?
- 3. To what extent is divorce compatible with religious teaching
- 4. Is Freud's theory the best explanation of religious belief?

SECTION E

ASPECTS OF CHRISTIANITY

- 1. What is meant by 'Feminist Theology'? What does it contribute to contemporary Christian thought?
- 2. Is it worth celebrating today what Martin Luther did exactly five centuries ago?
- 3. Assess the life and contribution of the recently canonized St.(Mother) Teresa.
- 4. Is Christian Unity a forlorn hope?

SECTION F

JUDAISM

- 1. How significant do you believe Abraham to be for Jews?
- 2. 'Yom Kippur is the most important festival in Judaism'. Assess this view.
- 3. 'Men have a superior role to women in Judaism'. Discuss this statement.
- 4. Is criticism of the modern state of Israel a form of anti-Semitism?

SECTION G

ISLAM

- 1. 'The Qur'an is still the main source of authority within Islam'. Assess this view.
- 2. Explain the significance of key events in the life of Muhammad after his call to be prophet.
- 3. Assess the influence of Sufism on the spread of Islam.
- 4. Evaluate Islamic teaching on the rights and status of women.

SECTION H

HINDUISM

- 1. Assess the importance of the Upanishads in Hindusim.
- 2. Examine the role the home plays in Hindu devotion.
- 3. Explain Hindu teaching about *karma*.
- 4. Examine and give an account of the special characteristics of Hinduism in the modern period.

SECTION I

BUDDHISM

- 1. Evaluate the view that the most important doctrine in Buddhism is the Four Noble Truths.
- 2. Evaluate the view that the single most important event in the history of Buddhism was the Buddha's experience under the *bodhi* tree.
- 3. Consider the history of the lay and monastic ideas of Therava Buddhism.
- 4. Examine some of the possible reasons why Buddhism is a popular religion in the West today.
